Her data plates and frame serial number indicate 23955 with a delivery date of May 1942. The engine had no serial number. The hood number was estimated and since I knew of someone in N Calif with a May GPW I just stenciled this one number higher!


I purchased the GPW from an IMVPA member in Caldwell and she looked like a basketcase. Al Mizner stopped by though and he got her started long enough to drive it up on my car hauler trailer:)

It had trashed frame horns —of course. I'd like to thank Don Wadley for loaning me one of his intact frames and using that as a point of reference. I welded in new frame horns and got the bumper repro front brackets on within "close enough" specs.

IMVPA member Brian rebuilt the tranny. I won't use his full name because I think he doesn't want more work as he's enjoying retirement ha! IMVPA member Benjamin S and Roy C helped with the front axle and kingpins.

This was a frame off, nut and bolt full restoration and it was a PITA! This is my second jeep so It's a little better than the first but it's definitely not over restored. I didn't fix dents and dings nor did I fill all the extra holes or use bondo. I like my MV to look like it's being used in the war and love for kids to crawl all over it.

Most of my parts are from RFJP.com out of Grants Pass Oregon. Mods? Yeah, I added an alternator, changed it to 12v, added LED brake lights at the rear and did a disk brake conversion. Haters gonna hate lol. The disks are from a GEO tracker and a nice fit but require spacers to fit the reproduction MD Juan combat wheels. It stops really good and cost about the same as rebuilding all of the old drums. There's always more to the story but let's end by thanking all of the IMVPA folks who turned wrenches, gave me advice
